19	6-3.2.2-E	A new section describing a four (4) step EAP response process that covers response from incident detection through termination and follow up was added. This section replaces the Emergency Detection, Evaluation and Classification Section in the previous format.
20	6-3.2.2-E	Step 1. Added a new emergency level to the classification system. There are now 4 emergency levels: High Flow; Non-Failure; Potential Failure; and Imminent Failure.
27	6-3.2.2-G	Added four (4) new categories to the preparedness section of the EAP. The new sections are: Evaluation of Detection and Response Time; Alternate Sources of Power; Training and Exercising; and Public Awareness and Communication.
