FERC Approves Freeport LNG Export Expansion Project

FERC has approved the construction of the Train 4 expansion at the Freeport LNG terminal in Texas, marking the Commission's fourth approval of a liquefied natural gas (LNG) export project this year, following last month's approval of the Driffwood and Port Arthur projects, and February's approval of the Venture Global Calcasieu Pass project. Commission Affirms Order 841 Storage Rule

FERC has affirmed its February 2018 rule on electric storage participation in regional electric power markets. This order provides important clarifications while affirming the Commission's efforts to remove barriers to the participation of electric storage resources in the regional markets and to enhance competition, promote greater market efficiency and help support the resilience of the bulk power system. FERC Rescinds Policy on Notices of Alleged Violations

FERC has rescinded its 2009 policy on issuing Notices of Alleged Violations (NAVs) regarding investigations. As it committed to do when it adopted the NAV policy, the Commission has evaluated the effectiveness of the policy. Based on this evaluation, today's order concludes that the policy's intended benefits have not materialized and the Commission now has better tools for providing transparency and, thus, the NAV policy is no longer warranted. Summer 2019 Reliability and Energy Market Assessment

FERC staff presented the Summer 209 Reliability and Energy Market Assessment that projects adequate reserve margins in all regions except ERCOT, growth in natural gas demand due to new LNG export capacity and battery storage and wind/solar capacity exceeding previous summer levels, with higher than average temperatures in the West, South and East.
