Dear Mr. Kunselman:

1. On April 24, 2019, in the above-referenced proceeding, you filed an Offer of Settlement (Settlement) on behalf of Stoneray Power Partners, LLC (Stoneray). On May 14, 2019, Commission Trial Staff filed comments supporting the Settlement. No other comments were filed. On May 28, 2019, the Settlement Judge certified the Settlement to the Commission as an uncontested settlement.¹

2. The Settlement addresses Stoneray's proposed annual revenue requirement for Reactive Supply and Voltage Control from Generation Sources Service, as that service is defined in Schedule 2 of the Midcontinent Independent System Operator, Inc. Open Access Transmission, Energy and Operating Reserve Markets Tariff, for the Stoneray wind-powered electric generation facility in Pipestone and Murray Counties, Minnesota.

3. Article III, section 3.7 of the Settlement provides that:

[n]othing in this Settlement is intended to affect the Commission's authority, pursuant to Section 205 of the Federal Power Act or otherwise, to review, accept (with or without conditions or modifications) or reject this Settlement, or the legal standard applicable to the exercise of such authority. Once approved, any

modification of the Settlement would be governed by the “just and reasonable” standard.

4. The Settlement resolves all issues set for hearing in these proceedings. The Settlement appears to be fair and reasonable and in the public interest, and is hereby approved. The Commission’s approval of this Settlement does not constitute approval of, or precedent regarding, any principle issue in these proceedings.

5. Stoneray is directed to make a compliance filing with revised tariff records in eTariff format,² within 30 days of this order, to reflect the Commission’s action in this order.

6. This order terminates Docket Nos. ER19-455-000 and ER19-455-001.
