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## 1 PROCEEDINGS

- 2 MR. FONTENOT: My name is Gerald J. Fontenot.
- 3 Spell my name as G-e-r-a-l-d J. Fontenot, F-o-n-t-e-n-o-t.
- 4 I own property that is designated as Parcel EVA-065. My
- 5 concern is that it is complete woodland they are going to
- 6 be crossing the property.
- 7 Right now there is a right-of-way for another
- 8 line that's designated as Texas Eastern -- has an existing
- 9 line crossing the property from east to west, west to east
- 10 and there is a right-of-way and they cleared the trees on
- 11 that right-of-way.
- 12 And this line is going to add another portion of
- 13 right-of-way, permanently say 50 feet wide and it is a 40
- 14 acre tract so it is roughly 1,320 feet long. So the
- 15 permanent right-of-way will consist of about an acre and a
- 16 half that they are going to remove and prevent trees from
- 17 growing again completely.
- 18 That's approximately what I have now and that's
- 19 what they are going to add on to. So we are going to go
- 20 from a 50 foot right-of-way to a hundred foot right-of-way
- 21 permanent, 50 feet just with this pipeline.
- 22 Temporary right-of-way is 125 feet wide by the
- 23 same quarter mile long which consists of roughly 3.8 acres
- 24 of land that they are going to clear trees on. Now trees
- 25 will be able to grow on all but the 50 feet later on but

- 1 that takes years for that to happen.
- 2 The trees that are there have been there for
- 3 many, many years. I don't know how many years to tell you
- 4 the truth. And then they are going to be crossing the
- 5 bayou, they come on the eastern end of my property and they
- 6 said they need 150 feet about 300 foot work area to drill
- 7 horizontal drill, directional drill. And that's over an
- 8 acre just by itself of destruction.
- 9 My concern is that you are going through an area
- 10 -- one that is woodland and this pipeline right-of-way is
- 11 going to remove the woodland from commerce. All we are
- 12 going to have is grass from that point on. I can't ever
- 13 grow trees on it again until the pipeline is removed.
- 14 Temporarily it is going to remove some of the
- 15 land, remove the trees and remove the productivity of the
- land for many years to come until the trees grow back.
- 17 This is primarily a hardwood area, it is a low-land --
- 18 that's another consideration is that these are -- this is
- 19 all low area.
- 20 I don't know what the wetlands part is, I don't
- 21 have any idea. But when you are crossing a bayou you are
- 22 talking about close to wetlands and flooding areas and that
- 23 kind of stuff so there are many concerns, but my primary
- 24 concern is that they are taking an acre and a half
- 25 permanent out of commerce all together, affecting the

- 1 environment.
- 2 The land is not going to be worth anything after
- 3 this pipeline runs through -- I mean that portion of the
- 4 land, the right-of-way portion. Now the commerce is trees.
- 5 After that there is nothing hunting maybe, that's about the
- 6 only thing you will be able to do on it.
- 7 So that's what my comment is basically concerning
- 8 is the commerce of the property that is being crossed. Is
- 9 there another alternative? I understand that they are
- 10 paralleling this Texas Eastern line for a great distance
- 11 and that makes it possibly easy for the pipeline people or
- 12 the right-of-way people or whatever it is, but it sure puts
- 13 a burden on the land owners.
- 14 You know once the corridor is established they
- 15 will want to tend to follow the same corridor and that's
- 16 putting burdens on particular land owners and I feel that
- 17 it's not being fair to us once we have something. I don't
- 18 want any more actually.
- 19 It's good to have the pipeline I guess for
- 20 commerce but it is also good to have trees for commerce, so
- 21 where is the balance? That's about all I have I guess for
- 22 now.
