
FERC Approves Transmission Rules to Secure a Reliable Energy Future

FERC to ensure the transmission grid can meet the nation's growing demand for reliable electricity with a new grid rule that outlines how to plan and pay for facilities that regions of the country will need to keep the lights on and power the American economy through the 21st Century, and a grid siting rule that outlines how the Commission will implement its limited authority over siting electricity transmission lines as directed by Congress in 2021.

The new grid rule, Order No. 1920, marks the first time in more than a decade that FERC has addressed transmission policy. The Grid Siting Rule, Order No. 1977, includes a Landowner Bill of Rights and directs applicants to develop engagement plans for outreach to environmental justice communities and Tribes.
