



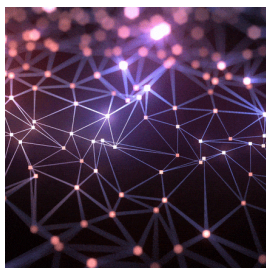

Mark Christie was named Chairman on January 20, 2025. Christie began his term as a FERC Commissioner on January 4, 2021, after having been nominated by President Trump in July 2020 and confirmed by the U.S. Senate on November 30, 2020.

At the February Commission Meeting, FERC [voted](#) unanimously to launch a review of issues associated with the co-location of large loads such as AI-enabled data centers at generating facilities in PJM, including whether the PJM tariff needs to establish rules to create clarity while ensuring grid reliability and fair costs to consumers.

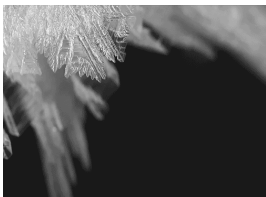
